What is Domestic Abuse?

- Domestic Abuse Act 2021 definition
- Victims are not confined to one gender, age (if over 16), ethnic group or socioeconomic group
- Includes "Honour" based abuse, Female Genital Mutilation and forced marriage
- "personally connected" means partner or family relationships including in laws and step family
- Controlling behaviour and coercive behaviour have set definitions

Behaviour of a person ("A") towards another person ("B") is "domestic abuse" if—

- (a)A and B are each aged 16 or over and are personally connected to each other, and
- (b)the behaviour is abusive.
- (3)Behaviour is "abusive" if it consists of any of the following—
- (a)physical or sexual abuse;
- (b)violent or threatening behaviour;
- (c)controlling or coercive behaviour;
- (d)economic abuse
- (e)psychological, emotional or other abuse;

and it does not matter whether the behaviour consists of a single incident or a course of conduct.

- (4)"Economic abuse" means any behaviour that has a substantial adverse effect on B's ability to—
- (a)acquire, use or maintain money or other property, or
- (b)obtain goods or services.
- (5)For the purposes of this Act A's behaviour may be behaviour "towards" B despite the fact that it consists of conduct directed at another person (for example, B's child).





Controlling and Coercive Behaviour – Home Office Definitions

Controlling behaviour

A range of acts designed to make a person subordinate and/or dependent by isolating them from sources of support, exploiting their resources and capacities for personal gain, depriving them of the means needed for independence, resistance and escape and regulating their everyday behaviour

Coercive behaviour

An act or a pattern of acts of assault, threats, humiliation and intimidation or other abuse that is used to harm, punish or frighten their victim





How many people are affected by Domestic Abuse?

one in 25 people experienced Domestic Abuse in the 12 months to March 2023, which equates to a rate of roughly 40 per 1,000 population

For Norfolk there were 18,879 Domestic Abuse related crimes in 2023-24


12.45 people per 1,000 population were affected

At least 420 households in Norfolk were owed a prevention or relief homelessness duty due to Domestic Abuse, 2022/23 financial year

How many older people in Norfolk are affected by domestic abuse?








How many older people in Norfolk need to flee to safe accommodation?

- Safeguarding concerns raised:
 - In 2023 there were in total 113 safeguarding concerns recorded, and this year to date we have 45 for 2024 so the sample is 158 concerns.
 - Types of abuse recorded include:
 - Domestic Abuse
 - Honour based abuse
 - Physical
 - Financial
 - Sexual
 - Neglect
 - Bullying
 - Psychological





What are the signs to look out for?

- We all need to be curious
- Look for behaviour changes, such as withdrawn, or frightened, flinching
- Lost or gained weight?
- Has someone else moved in? cuckooing?
- Is someone else taking care of their finances?
- Someone else talking on their behalf?
- Do they have unexplained bruises?
- Overhearing raised voices?
- Carer breakdown



Case study

- S and R
 - Mother and Daughter
 - Carer breakdown
 - Dependant on one another
 - Coercive control
 - Constantly moving, no fixed or long time abode
 - Not allowing staff to support mum
 - Staff quickly identified something was not right
 - Referral to Adult Safeguarding Board (MASH)





What to be aware of if someone discloses domestic abuse

- Leaving may not be the "answer"
- The person may not be ready to leave
- Leaving or talking about leaving to the perpetrator is likely to be a trigger to make the abuse worse
- Is the person safe talking to you?
- Dependant on family member
